

What is a Resume?

A resume is a formal document that tells potential employers why they should hire you. Resumes are important because they give employers a first impression of you before they even meet you. Resumes are a great way to grab the attention of employers and show off your skill sets, education and accomplishments. A great resume has the power to propel you to your dream job, so here are some tips to make your resume stand out for all the right reasons!



TIP: Ask a parent, friend or teacher to proofread your resume for you. They may find a mistake you didn't even notice!

A GREAT RESUME SHOULD:

Be precise and short! Resumes should only be one page. You should only put necessary information like your name, email address and phone number, education, and relative job experience and skills on your resume.

Grab the attention of employers. You've got to stand out against all the other applicants for employers to notice you. If your resume looks just like everyone else's, chances are it's not going to make a lasting impression.

Use bullet points! Using bullet points is the best way to convey important information in a concise way. Bullet points are easy to read and look clean on a page.

Be tailored for the job you're applying for.

Before you apply for a job, look over the job description and company. Match your skills with keywords from the job description. If you are applying to work in a fast-paced environment, it would be beneficial to note you are quick with deadlines and work well under pressure.

Proofread! Re-read your resume before hitting the submit button. You may have missed a typo, misspelled word or improper grammar. Your resume is a reflection of yourself and if you have a resume full of errors, future employers may not take you

A cover letter is a personalized letter you write for the company you're applying for and telling them why you should be hired. You should use your cover letter to introduce yourself and express your interest in the position. A cover letter presents you with the opportunity to go further into the points you make in your resume. Be specific! Your tone in a cover letter should be professional but friendly. Also, place it before your resume!





WALKER started as a teller at First National Bank. working her way up to lead/digital banking specialist. She credits climbing the ladder to learning on the job and to her boss, Blake Gunn, for having faith in her.

"There are more opportunities than you think in banking," Briana said. "I didn't realize when I was younger that there's a lot that goes on behind the scenes operationally just to run a standard day at the bank. There are jobs in this field that fit all different types of personalities and interests, not just those interested in math/finance," Her day-to-day responsibilities include assisting customers and employers with all digital matters. This could look like answering questions or solving problems customers are having while they use the First National Bank website and mobile app.

"With technology advancing every day, my job is constantly evolving, and that excites me," Briana said. "A big misconception about my job, and a lot of other banking jobs, is that you must excel in mathematics to be successful. If you are a good hands-on learner and selfmotivated, you can easily achieve any goals in this field."
