Arkansas School for the Deaf Update

Casey Brown with the Arkansas School for the Deaf (ASD) and the Arkansas Deaf Career Center (ADCC) submitted the following events.

First, in October, the Arkansas Deaf Career Center (ADCC) and ASD co-hosted College Night 101 for high school students and their families. Numerous agencies and colleges were there to meet with students and share resources for planning for a successful future! They enjoyed a fun interactive trivia game about Financial Aid with door prizes for the winners.

The ADCC staff members meet every Tuesday afternoon with the ASD ARS Vocational Rehab counselor to talk about Self-Advocacy, future careers, Deaf rights, college and training options, and independent living skills of their students.



Currently, eight young adult clients are enrolled in the ADCC Elevate program.



Sending an email or chatting on the phone can be challenging for people with both significant vision and hearing loss. iCanConnect is a national program that provides free equipment and training to help people stay connected with friends, family, and the world.





iCanConnect provides equipment including smartphones, tablets, computers, screen readers, braille equipment, and software to people with significant combined vision and hearing loss who meet federal income and disability guidelines.

iCanConnect is available in all 50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa and the Northern Mariana Islands. Each state has its own contact.

iCanConnect was established by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and is also known as the National Deaf-Blind Equipment Distribution Program (NDBEDP).
