## Arkansas' Unemployment Rate Declines to 2.7% in May

**Little Rock, Ark., June 16, 2023-** Today the Arkansas Division of Workforce Services, in conjunction with the Bureau of Labor Statistics, announced Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point, from 2.8% in April to 2.7% in May. The United States' jobless rate increased over the month, from 3.4% in April to 3.7% in May.

## Arkansas Civilian Labor Force Summary:

- May marks the eighth consecutive month of employment gains in Arkansas. Over the month, the civilian labor force increased along with the number of employed Arkansans, setting new record highs in the State. Arkansas' unemployment rate dropped to the lowest it has ever been as unemployment declined to a new record low of 37,095.
- Compared to May 2022, there are 16,675 more employed in the State. The number of unemployed is down 6,428, while the unemployment rate is down five-tenths of a percentage point over the year. Arkansas' labor force participation rate remains slightly lower than the 57.7% reported in May 2022.

## Arkansas Nonfarm Payroll Job Summary:

- Nonfarm payroll jobs rose to 1,368,900 in May, a new record high number of jobs. Leisure and Hospitality added the most jobs, up 3,100. Other notable increases occurred in Construction (+1,300), Private Education and Health Services (+1,300), Manufacturing (+1,200), and Other Services (+1,100).
- Compared to May 2022, Arkansas' nonfarm payroll jobs are up 36,700. The largest gains were in Leisure and Hospitality (+11,000), Private Education and Health Services (+6,100), Construction (+5,600), Trade-Transportation-Utilities (+5,400), Manufacturing (+3,100), and Other Services (+3,100).



## Arkansas Nonfarm Payroll Jobs (Not Seasonally Adjusted, In Thousands)



## About the Arkansas Department of Commerce:


