NWA EMPLOYER FORUM OFFERS APPRENTICESHIP AS A SOLUTION

"Employers Growing Talent through Apprenticeships"

SPRINGDALE— On Thursday, April 25, 8:30 a.m. - noon, the Arkansas Department of Workforce Services (ADWS) will host an informational forum on apprenticeship for local employers at The Jones Center, 922 E Emma Ave, Springdale, AR. This event will be held in partnership with the Northwest Arkansas Economic Development District, the Northwest Arkansas Council and the Bentonville, Fayetteville, Rogers-Lowell, Siloam Springs, and Springdale chambers of commerce. ADWS and its partners aim to increase employer awareness, interest, and commitment regarding the use of registered apprenticeship as a workforce development tool.

The forum, "Employers Growing Talent through Apprenticeships," is an opportunity for business leaders and HR managers to learn about the value of apprenticeship, its recent expansion into new industries and occupations, and the resources available to assist throughout the implementation process. Speakers include apprenticeship experts, consultants, and officials from the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) - Office of Apprenticeship, the State Office of Apprenticeship- Arkansas Career Education, and ADWS, which currently administers two DOL-funded registered apprenticeship grants. There will be a panel discussion featuring executives from Tyson Foods, Simmons Bank, UAMS- College of Nursing, the Arkansas Center for Data Sciences, and the National Apprenticeship Training Foundation. Attendees will also hear testimonials from employers currently implementing apprenticeship programs and participating apprentices. Following the panel, employers will have an opportunity to interact with apprenticeship experts in targeted Q&A sessions.
