After Hurricane Katrina, ARS provided crucial support, supplying hearing aids and assisting with educational expenses. This support allowed Brandy to complete a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance at the University of

Arkansas, marking the beginning of her professional journey.

Starting her career as a dance educator at the Arkansas School for the Deaf, Brandy didn't give up on her passion. She founded the "Listen With Your Eyes

Dance Troupe" and continued as a solo artist, Unique the Deaf Dance. Achieving second place in Deaf Got Talent in 2022, Brandy is now pursuing a Master of Fine Arts in Choreography at Jacksonville University, expanding possibilities for herself and the dance world.
